5. The ride-hailing giant Uber has been accused by the Portland City Hall transport officials' investigation team of using a software "Greyball" to evade the Portland regulators. The New York Times has reported that when Uber operated illegally in Portland (2014) it used the software "Greyball" to evade a city crackdown. The app blocked suspected city inspectors, then filled the screens of inspectors' smartphones with fake rides while Uber drivers escaped undetected. The city entered into contracts with Uber in 2015. But the city officials launched an investigation this week, demanding to know if use of the software continued even after the city entered into contracts with Uber. They also wanted to know who it was used to evade: inspectors or unwanted customers.

In the context of this investigation Uber's chief security officer, Joe Sullivan issued a statement accepting the use of the software. According to him this technology is used to hide the standard city app view for individual riders, enabling Uber to HMTS 2001 2

It's been used for many purposes, for example: the testing of new features by employees; marketing promotions; fraud prevention; to protect Uber's partners from physical harm; and to deter riders using the app in violation of the company's terms of service. Mr. Sullivan also acknowledged that a review process regarding the use of the software is in progress and that they are expressly prohibiting its use to target action by local regulators.
